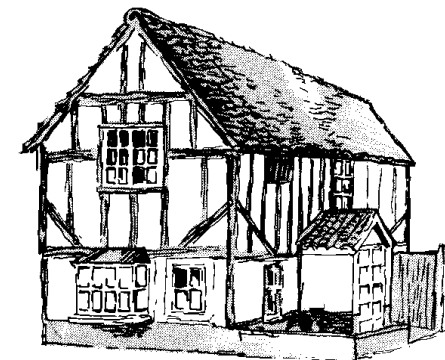

THE LEATHERHEAD & DISTRICT LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY

was established in 1946 to study the history and natural history of Ashtead, Bookham, Fetcham, Leatherhead and the surrounding area. It has a library of local history as well as extensive archives of photographs and documents relating to the area.

The Society meets in the evening of the third Friday in the month from September to May at the Letherhead Institute at the top of Leatherhead High Street. Lectures are given by visiting speakers and members on various topics relating to the area. Members can also make visits to places of special interest.

The *Proceedings* of the Society are published annually and a quarterly newsletter contains details of events along with articles written by members about their particular areas of interest.

Publication is an essential part of the Society's activities and members have contributed to many books that have and still are being published on local history which are available at the Society's Museum and from book shops.

THE LEATHERHEAD MUSEUM OF LOCAL HISTORY

Owned by the Society, this MLA Accredited museum is housed in much altered 17th century cottage sited at the junction of The Crescent and Church Street. Opened to the public in 1980 after extensive restoration, it serves as the Society's headquarters.

Inside there are displays of many items of interest held by the Society including examples of products from now defunct local industries such as Ashtead Pottery, Goblin [cleaners and Teasmade] and Ronson. Displays also cover local Roman and other archaeology; early domestic kitchen and laundry equipment and pastimes. Albums contain copies of some of the photographs from the Society's Collection.

There is a shop selling the Society's and other publications plus souvenirs. In the small paved garden can be seen the original swan from the old Swan Hotel in Leatherhead, a 1920s petrol pump and a disused well, still over 30 feet deep.

Admission is free but donations are welcome to help run this privately run enterprise.

School & private visits by arrangement

Step free access is available into the garden and the rear of the building but internally there are narrow passages and a steep staircase. Every effort will be made to aid access but advanced notice may be desirable.
