On the 24th September 1914, 2,000 men of the 21st Battalion of The Royal Fusiliers, young men drawn from English Public Schools and Universities arrived in Ashtead under the command of Lieutenant-Colonel J. Stuart-Worley. They were billeted locally and much of their training was carried out on Ashtead Common or Ashtead Park House Grounds. On the 13th October 1914, King George V inspected the 18th and 19th Battalion on Epsom Downs. He then went to Ashtead Park to the 21th Battalion and finally on to Leatherhead where the 20th Battalion were based. In March 1915 the 21st moved to Woodcote Park Camp, Epsom. The 21th Battalion was disbanded in April 1916 as many of the men took up commissions.
